Foreword by the Minister for Fisheries & Forestry, Honourable Kalaveti Vodo Ravu



This financial year, 2023-2024, will be the first full year for the Coalition Government to conduct its implementation of a well thought out manifesto after winning the election and taking up office from the previous administration since December 2023. Guided by its Manifesto, the recently declared resolutions from the National Economic Summit, and Fiji's commitments to various conventions such as the Paris Agreement, United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Seoul Forest Declaration and many other forest related conventions, the Ministry of Forestry is dedicated in protecting, restoring and sustainably managing Fiji's forests as one of the building blocks for social, environmental and economic development.

This Coalition government, through the Ministry of Forestry, is committed to elevating the forestry sector to contribute to socio-economic growth and uplift the livelihoods of forest dependents. It will do this by working closely with its key stakeholders such as the Pine and Mahogany industries and also the forest resource owners.

Forestry's flagship and national tree planting initiative to grow 1,800ha annually is one of the nature-based solutions the Ministry will continue to adopt to contribute

to Fiji's green recovery, prompting economic activity and empowering resource owners and industries, while improving livelihoods in the process. This tree planting initiative which is aligned to Fijis 20-year National Development Plan, cuts across all other key roles of the Ministry in ensuring there is a sustainable supply of timber for local and international demands, including other forest-related needs. This also fits perfectly to the implementation of Fiji's Forest Emissions Reduction Programme Agreement (ERPA) signed in 2021 with the World Bank ensuring results-based payments are awarded towards efforts of minimising carbon emissions and to further reduce Fiji's carbon footprint.

Uplifting the resource owners and their sources of livelihood is one of the cornerstones of this Coalition government and the Ministry is committed to doing this with increased budget in all relevant programmes that will assist resource owners with the harvesting of their matured forest resources to build and repair homes, build the capacity of resource owners through skills-based training, and support the establishment of forest based MSMEs. In addition, the work on forest certification will be pursued relentlessly by the Ministry to ensure access to niche markets and also to obtain the maximum value of forest products that will be enjoyed by all players in the chain of custody. This financial year's Costed Annual Operational Plan, with increased funding by Government, is aimed at continuing the momentum of elevating the forestry agenda. Our actions today will determine the kind of future we leave behind for our future generations and the increased budget allocation is a clear indication of Government's commitment in taking care of our future generations.

I applaud the Permanent Secretary and the Senior Leadership Team and staff of the Ministry for their dedication in the past, and I have every confidence that they will continue to be relentless in contributing to Government's overarching national development agenda.

I commend the 2023-2024 Costed Annual Operational Plan to all staff and stakeholders.

Statement from the Permanent Secretary

I am pleased to present the Ministry of Forestry's Costed Annual Operational Plan for the financial year 2023-2024. This is now the third year of the forestry sector's economic recovery plan. With a target of \$418.6M for three years beginning with 2021-2022FY, the sector has achieved \$246.2M to date which is 58.8% of the target. Sustained and smart collaboration with our key forestry stakeholders has enabled the Ministry to contribute to socio-economic growth in the forestry sector. The Ministry will continue to facilitate the needs of the sector this year to achieve its target and focus on initiatives that bring greater returns on investment.

Ensuring that the Ministry maintains an optimal capital and operating expenditure mix, the total budget for the Ministry is \$21.3M, of which \$12.1M (56.8%) is for operating expenditure, \$7.7M (36.1%) for capital expenditure and \$1.4M (6.6%) as VAT. This budget increase of \$3.6M (20.3%)



will ensure that the Ministry continues to focus on its goal of sustainably managing Fiji's forests and forest products while contributing to sustainable socio-economic growth and environmental protection.

With Fiji's national tree-planting programme onto its fifth year, the Ministry will centre its focus on planting 1,800ha annually. This annual target is aligned to the targets set in the Fiji 20-year National Development Plan. We will continue to coordinate and facilitate this with any stakeholder willing to plant trees for Fiji. Over 18 million trees and mangroves have been planted in over 18,000 hectares since the inception of the initiative in 2019. This has been possible with the support from the landowning communities, forestry sector industries and other private organisations, women and youth organisations, Government agencies, civil society organisations, academic institutions, faith-based organisations, and the general public. The continued financial support from government and relevant donor agencies such as the World Bank and UN FAO have been instrumental in supporting our Forest and Landscape Restoration (FLR) initiatives, concurrently addressing, and supporting Fiji's Emission Reduction Programme. With increased budget to support our maritime communities, the Ministry will continue its assistance in sustainably harvesting their matured pine trees to help build homes and communal facilities that will improve their standard of living. Furthermore, we acknowledge the foresight of the Fijian Government in subsiding shipping costs to transport timber to the mainland, ensuring simultaneous benefits for both pine resource owners and the forest-based industries. The decision by this Government to revert the management of the Mahogany industry to the Ministry has been welcomed by many, especially the resource owners who have been deprived of the true benefits of their resources through poor governance structures and management in the past. The Ministry is ready to take back this role and ensure benefits are equally realised by all relevant stakeholders. Supporting forest based MSMEs is another key initiative of the Ministry and with the 300% increase in the Forest Subsidy Programme budget, this will certainly boost our assistance to help build capacity and establish MSMEs that will contribute to Fiji's socio-economic growth.

Investing in technology coupled with the development IT Solutions to support automation of key processes to promote operational efficiency will ensure that the Ministry continue to improve our business processes and that business transactions are carried out with ease. The Ministry will continue to work with its partners in sustainably developing the forestry sector not only to contribute to Fiji's socio-economic growth, but also to help protect our environment and enhance ecosystem services and biodiversity growth.

I look forward to leading the team in implementing the Ministry's 2023-2024 Costed Annual Operational Plan and sincerely wish all the stakeholders in the forestry sector the very best for this financial year.

Aim of the Operational Plan

This Operational Plan (OP) aims to implement the initiatives set out in the Ministry of Forestry's 13-year Strategic Development Plan (SDP), and the Forestry goals and priorities in Fiji's National Development Plan (NDP) in addition to the key initiatives of the Coalition government.

Recovering from the setbacks of COVID-19 and a series of natural disasters, this Plan focuses on elevating the livelihoods of the Fijian people and generating optimum returns on investments for socio-economic growth whilst also striking a balance in protecting Fiji's natural environment.

This year will be the 3rd year for the Ministry's economic recovery plan and to date, the forestry sector has achieved more than \$200M in revenue which is 39.9% against the target of \$418.6M. The Ministry will continue to facilitate socio-economic growth by striving to achieve its revenue target of over \$400M for these 3 years.

This Plan provides a clear conduit for the Ministry to achieve these goals and priorities within its allocated resources and in collaboration with its partners.

2023-2024 Budget Highlights

The total budget for the Ministry in 2023-2024 is \$21.3 million, comprising \$12.1 million for operating expenditure (SEG 1-7), \$7.7 million for capital expenditure (SEG 8-9) and VAT (SEG 13) of \$1.4 million. The total budget represents an increase of \$3.6 million (20.3%) when compared to the 2022-2023 budget of \$17.7 million.

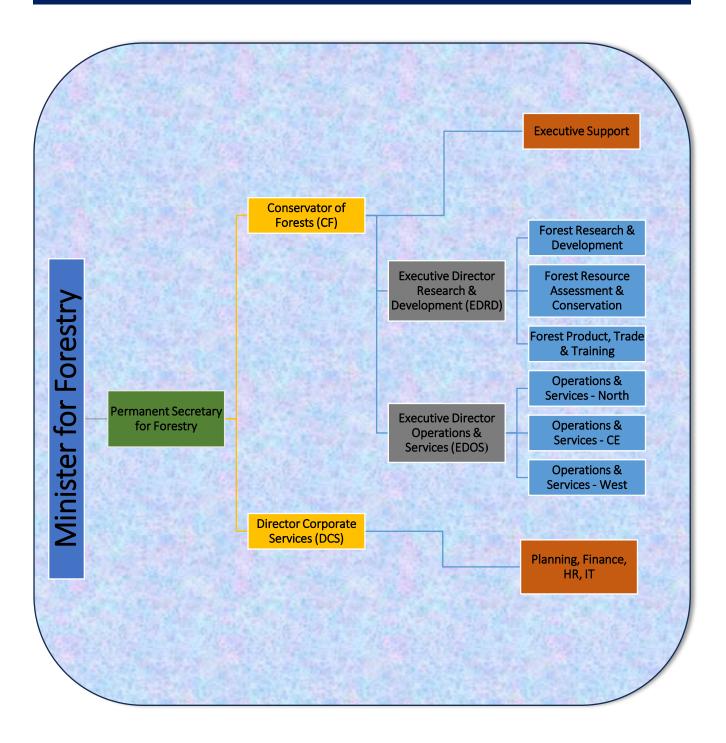

Strategic Workforce Plan

The Ministry has developed its Strategic Workforce Plan (SWP) for FY2023 – 2024. The SWP augments the Ministry's capacity for improved business planning and high quality, evidence-based advice.

The Ministry has an approved staff establishment of 272 posts, of which 142 (52.2%) are established posts, 86 (31.6%) are GWE posts and 45 (16.5%) are project posts. The current staffing strength as at 01 August 2023 stands at 229 which is 84.2% of the approved posts.

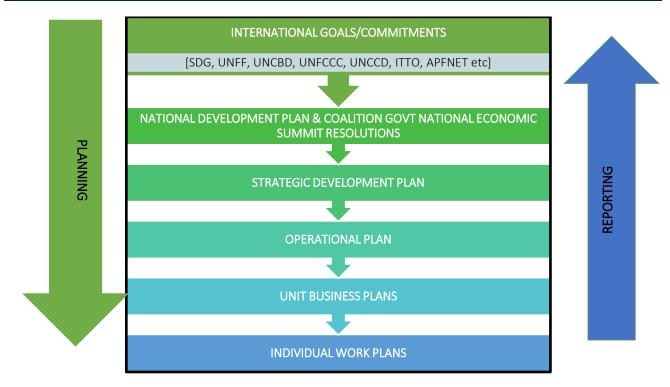

Description of Strategic Goals & Priorities

The Ministry of Forestry identified four (4) strategic goals and six (6) strategic priority areas for its SDP 2017-2030. Within these six strategic priority areas, there are Outcomes with measurable KPIs. The SDP 2017-2030 is aligned to the NDP (five- and twenty-year plans) requirements and global commitments to which Fiji is a party. Initiatives undertaken by the Ministry of Forestry in this AOP 2019-2020, and subsequent OPs will contribute outputs aggregating towards the achievement of the strategic priorities associated with each strategic goal of the SDP.

The four strategic goals are:

- SG 1 Establish sustainable life cycle management of forest resources in Fiji.
- SG 2 Improve the socio-economic impact of Forests.
- SG 3 Contribute positively to the Global Environment.
- SG 4 Substantially improve service delivery.

The six strategic priorities are:

- SP 1 Cohesive Legislation, Regulation, Policy, Guidelines & Compliance
 - SP 1 is geared towards articulating a consistent long-term approach with regards to legislation, regulation, policy, and compliance mechanisms associated with forests and forestry.
- SP 2 Enhance Sustainable Forests Management Frameworks and Implementation of SFM
 - SP 2 is all about establishing clear sustainable implementation mechanisms for forest strategies to be effective over a long period of time.
- SP 3 Capacity Building (Ministry & Stakeholders)
 - SP 3 focuses on bringing theory to practice. The Ministry will lead the way in analysing capacity and capabilities necessary to achieving the desired outcomes of the sector; engage its personnel, infrastructure, partners, and communities in developing research and knowledge necessary to achieve the best outcomes for now and the distant future.
- SP 4 Stewardship
 - SP 4 is about commitment to stewardship of national resources as well as the moral obligation towards global environmental responsibilities and commitments.
- SP 5 Forest Financing
 - SP 5 is all about looking at, developing, improving and/or implementing financial strategies and mechanisms to support the sustainable management of forests.
- SP 6 Organisation Effectiveness
 - SP 6 focuses on the Ministry itself. It looks at the capacity and the capability of the Ministry to be able to produce what it has set as its goals. It looks at efficiency, in terms of personnel, processes and even information management. It ensures that the Ministry is positioned to achieve what it has set out to achieve in the context of people, information, and infrastructure.
