The Ministry of Forestry is responsible for the sustainable management of Fiji's forest resources, which currently occupies 56% of Fiji's total landmass. These forest resources are vital to the economy in terms of ecological, social, environment and economic aspects and it is the

Furthermore, the Ministry will continue to support communities and forest resource owners with the provision of harvesting & value-adding machines and sound technical advice to sustainably utilise and manage their resources for their livelihood.

The Ministry plans to engage its stakeholders and partners in a more meaningful and productive manner, as well as streamlining its own policies, processes and services to better serve the people of Fiji.

I commend this Operational Plan in its entirety to all staff of the Ministry and wish everyone success in its implementation.

## MINISTRY OF FORESTRY INPUT ALLOCATION

### 2018-2019 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The total budget for the Ministry in 2018-2019 is \$17.1 million, comprising \$12.6 million for operating expenditure, \$3.8 million for capital expenditure and VAT of \$0.7 million. This represents an increase of \$1.0 million (6.5%) when compared to the 2017-2018 budget of \$16.0 million.

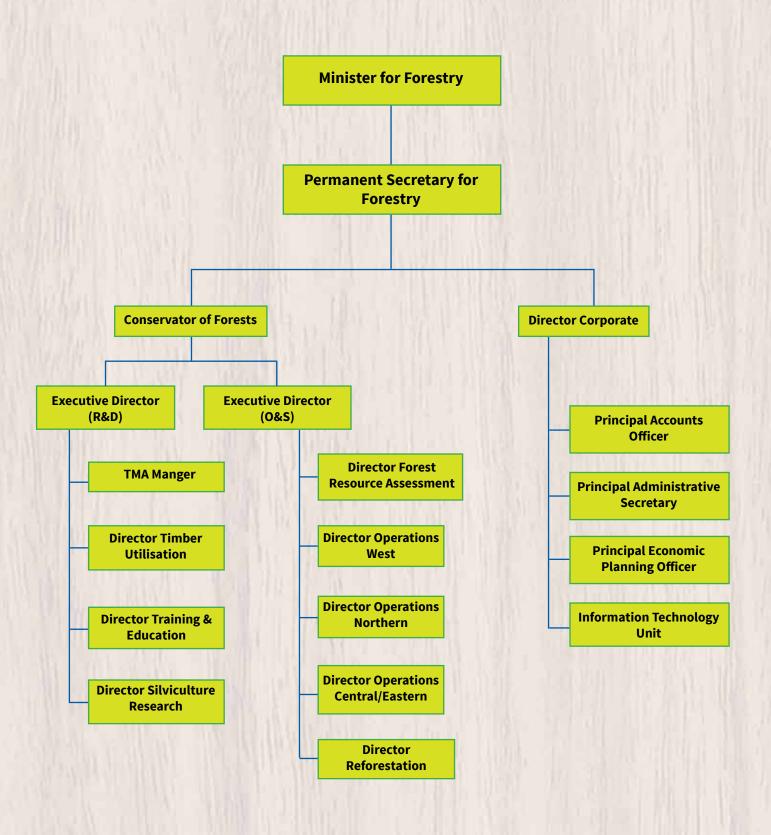
### SITUATION ANALYSIS

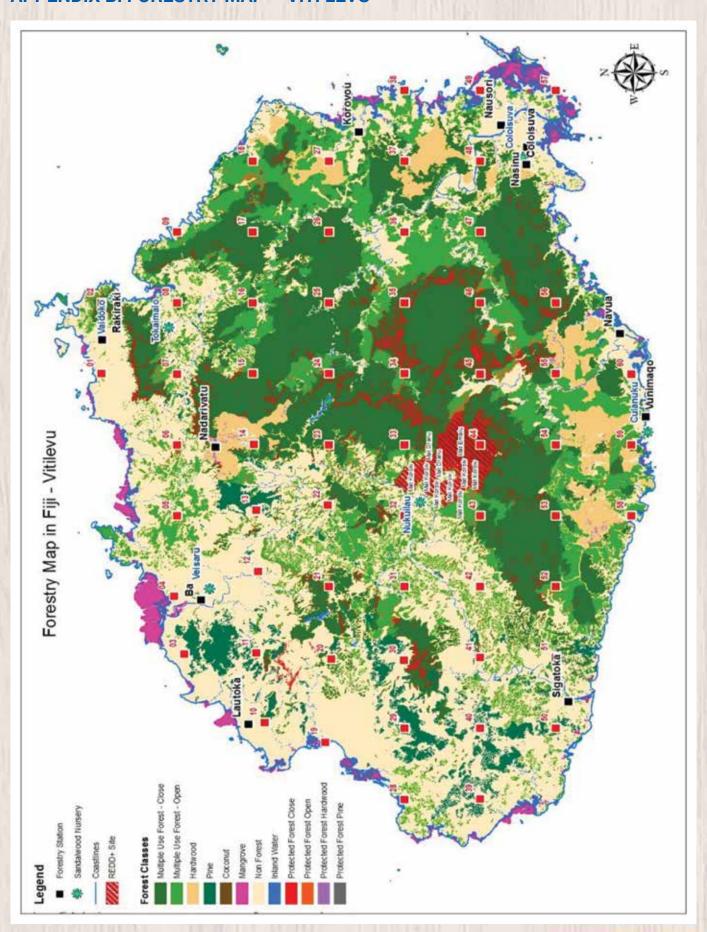

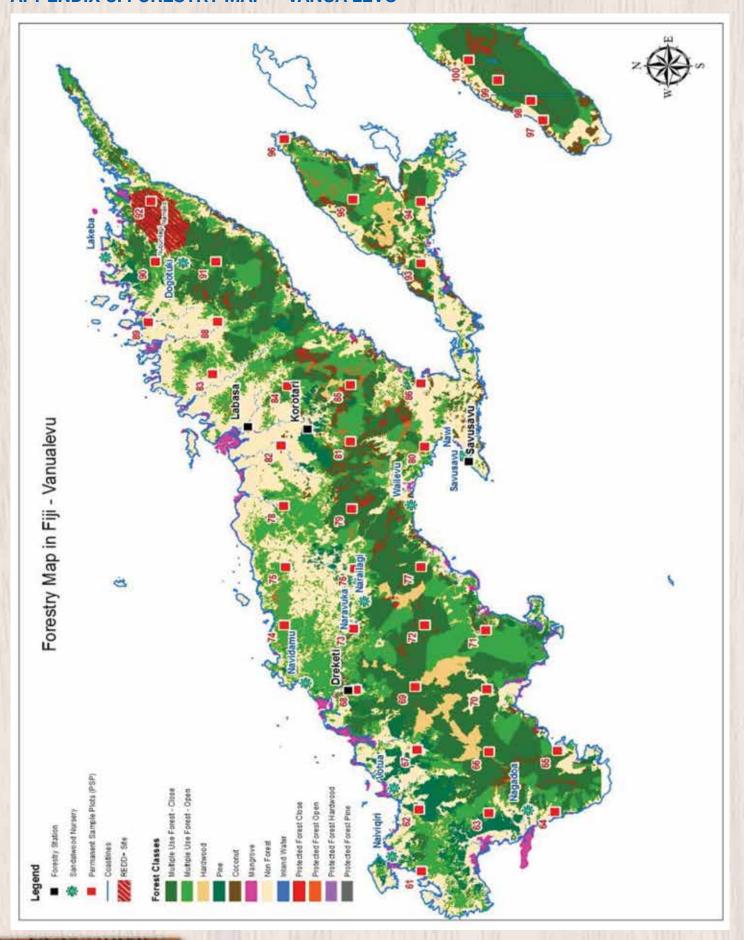


## **APPENDIX B: FORESTRY MAP - VITI LEVU**
