Foreword by the Minister for Forestry, Honourable Osea Naiqamu

Fiji has been unfortunate to have experienced a series of disasters in a span of 5 months since December 2019. Tropical Cyclones Sarai and Tino affected Fiji in December 2019 and January 2020 respectively, which called for a Multi-Agency approach in addressing post disaster response. On 19 March, Fiji received its first case of the novel Coronavirus which resulted in an overhaul of resources focusing mainly in combating this deadly disease. While concentrating on COVID-19 preparedness and response plan, Fiji was struck again by a Category 4 Tropical Cyclone Harold which destroyed homes and sources of livelihoods including the damaging of trees and forests.

In light of the above events, this has made the Ministry more committed to escalate tree planting, our core role, at the highest level to support Fijians' livelihood, food security, business development and economic recovery. The tree planting target has now increased from 1 million annually (4MT4Y Initiative) to 2 million annually under the 30 Million Tree in 15 Years (30MT15Y) Initiative.

Trees and forests play crucial and multiple roles in mitigating climate change, protecting the natural environment and enhancing biodiversity, ensuring clean water and healthy food sources and contributing to socio-economic development. The Emissions Reduction Programme Agreement (ERPA) that will be signed this financial year, prompting the commencement of the 5 year Emission Reduction Programme (ERP) will ensure that Fiji continues to practice sustainable forests and land management that will safeguard the continuous provision of these ecosystem services and subsequently secure equitable returns to resource owners for the preservation and protection of their trees and forests.

With the global pandemic that haunts us today and affecting most Sectors, the Natural Resource Sector now plays critical roles in the livelihoods of the Fijian people and the economy as a whole. I am confident that being part of the Natural Resource Sector, the Ministry of Forestry will play its part by continuing its mass tree planting and restoring its forests, supporting local businesses in the Forestry sector, supporting income generating projects with communities, and helping rebuild lives and homes destroyed during these unfortunate events.

I am assured that my Ministry will live up to the expectations of the Fijian people in fulfilling its main roles and responsibilities, and will continue to sustainably manage and protect this natural wealth, our forests. I commend this 2020-2021 Costed Annual Operational Plan and believe that the staff will persistently pursue service excellence as we implement our deliverables with the support of all our stakeholders and partners.

Supporting income generating projects and MSMEs, and contributing to food security and socio-economic development are some of the initiatives that we will continue to implement for the benefits of all Fijians.

The Ministry is committed to continue assisting maritime and rural communities in harvesting their matured forest resources for their livelihood and also rebuilding homes from salvaged trees post cyclones.

Latest technologies such as the use of drones and tablets have been acquired to enhance our monitoring and surveillance capabilities, coupled with the generation of real time information on all forest operations. The Ministry will continue to improve on this with the assistance of key partners and stakeholders through the development of MOUs.

The Ministry has revamped its Website and will continue to provide on-time and up-to-date forestry and forest-related information and an opportunity for visitors to express their issues and grievances and demand for immediate redress. In addition, online licensing is nearing completion and will be fully operational in 2020-2021. This will address the "ease of doing business" initiative and also ensure that the public can access our services from their safe environment during this time where physical distancing is paramount.

This year and the years ahead will no doubt be a challenging time for all Fijians; however I am confident that the staff of the Ministry of Forestry will do its part in restoring some form of normalcy for our beloved nation. I commend this Plan in its entirety to all staff of the Ministry and wish them well in its implementation.



MINISTRY OF FORESTRY INPUT ALLOCATION

2020-2021 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The total budget for the Ministry in 2020-2021 is \$15.7 million, comprising \$10.1 million for operating expenditure (SEG 1-7), \$4.9 million for capital expenditure (SEG 8-9) and VAT (SEG 13) of \$0.7 million. The total budget represents an increase of \$0.9 million (6.3%) when compared to the 2019-2020 COVID19-revised budget of \$14.8 million.



STRATEGIC WORKFORCE PLAN

The Ministry has developed its draft Strategic Workforce Plan (SWP) for FY2020 – 2021. The SWP augments the Ministry's capacity for improved business planning and high quality, evidence-based advice.

The Ministry has an approved staff establishment of 274 posts, of which 147 (54%) are established posts, 93 (34%) are GWE posts and 34 (12%) are project posts. The current staffing strength as at 31st July 2020 stands at 237 which is 86.5% of the approved posts.

DESCRIPTION OF STRATEGIC GOALS AND PRIORITIES

The Ministry of Forestry identified four (4) strategic goals and six (6) strategic priority areas for its SDP 2017-2030. Within these six strategic priority areas, there are Outcomes with measurable KPIs. The SDP 2017-2030 is aligned to the NDP (five and twenty year plan) requirements and global commitments that Fiji is a party to. Initiatives undertaken by the Ministry of Forestry in this OP 2019-2020 and subsequent OPs will contribute outputs aggregating towards the achievement of the strategic priorities associated with each strategic goal of the SDP.

The four strategic goals are:

SG1 - Establish sustainable life cycle management of forest resources in Fiji

SG2 - Improve the socio-economic impact of Forests

SG3 - Contribute positively to the Global Environment

SG4 - Substantially improve service delivery

The six strategic priorities are:

SP1 - Cohesive Legislation, Regulation, Policy, Guidelines & Compliance

SP1 is geared towards articulating a consistent long term approach with regards to legislation, regulation, policy, and compliance mechanisms associated with forests and forestry.

SP2 - Enhance Sustainable Forests Management Frameworks And Implementation of SFM

SP2 is all about establishing clear sustainable implementation mechanisms for forest strategies to be effective over a long period of time.

SP3 - Capacity Building (Ministry & Stakeholders)

SP3 focuses on bringing theory to practice. The Ministry will lead the way in analyzing capacity and capabilities necessary to achieving the desired outcomes of the sector; and engage its personnel, infrastructure, partners, and communities in developing research and knowledge necessary to achieve the best outcomes for now and the distant future.

SP4 – Stewardship

SP 4 is about commitment to stewardship of national resources, as well as the moral obligation towards global environmental responsibilities and commitments.

SP5 - Forest Financing

SP5 is all about looking at, developing, improving and/or implementing financial strategies and mechanisms to support sustainable management of forests.

SP6 - Organisation Effectiveness

SP6 focuses on the Ministry itself. It looks at the capacity and the capability of the Ministry in being able to produce what it has set up as its goals. It looks at efficiency, in terms of personnel, processes and even information management. It ensures that the Ministry is positioned to achieve what it has set out to achieve in context of people, information and infrastructure.



This is clearly shown in the above model with the Economy at the core of Government's efforts; to generate revenue from as many sectors as possible, and from a forestry perspective, the act of growing the economy must be done in a sustainable manner to cater for current and future generations, but importantly also to address climate change, environmental and conservation efforts, among others.




